Natasha Yang and Michaela Capolicchio (both '18) were amongst 40 Quebec students chosen at the Provincial Science Fair to represent Quebec at the Canada Wide Science Fair.

Julia Capolicchio, Sara Cohen, Sarit Kang-Auger, Ziting (Cathy) Li, Tara Seirafi (all '20), Anne Sarah Dickman, Camille Poulin, Michaela Capolicchio, Natasha Yang, Carolanne Carr (all '18) and Maria Kametani '17 all received highest distinctions and great distinction awards at The Montreal Regional Science and Technology Fair at Concordia University.

Grade 2 participated in the FIRST LEGO LEAGUE JR, where they showcased their Creature Craze robots.

Two Study teams advanced to the 2017 provincial FIRST LEGO LEAGUE Robotics tournament. One senior team received the award for "best robot design."

Elizabeth Jacob, Michaela Simon-Novy (both '17), Audrey Desjardins, Simone Aslan, Lola Ribeiro-Gomez, and Luiza Nogueira Costa (all '18) represented The Study at the Technovation Montreal Regional Competition, with the development of two acclaimed apps.

Eighteen students participated in the two-day Regional World Scholars Cup. Mia Calandriello, Amel Melanson and Tara Seirafi (all '20) placed second overall in the Junior competition. All students qualified for the Global Round in Greece. At the Global Round, Taya Ismail '20 and teammates received 4 silver and 2 gold medals and qualified for the WSC Tournament of Champions at Yale University in November 2018.

Grade 3 to 6 students wrote the Canada Wide Mathematics Competition. In grade 3, Kelsey Li received the Thales medal and qualified for National Honour Roll ranking. In grade 4, Ava Seirafi received the Byron-Germain Medal. In grade 5, Ella Qu received the Fibonacci medal. All grade 6 students qualified for the National Honour roll ranking, and Amy Steiner also received the Pythagoras medal.

In the Galois contest, Qianqian Zhou '18 ranked first in Quebec. In the Cayley contest, Jiayi Li '18 ranked seventh in Quebec.

Deschanel Li, Maria Kametani, Morgane-Marie Dackiw (all '17), Qianqian Zhou, Natasha Yang and Minyi Zhang (all '18) participated in the (CTMC) Canadian Team Mathematics Contest and placed second overall.

Three Study teams participated in Operations Research Challenge at Concordia University. In third place was Zoe Wong, Deschanel Li, Maria Kametani, Emma Dubroca (all '17) and in fifth place was Yuzhu Chen '19, Simone Aslan and Minyi Zhang (both '18).
